IWA Executive Committee Report for the year 2013

COMMUNITY SERVICE

1. GOONJ DONATION DRIVE

The year began with IWA organizing the Goonj Donation Drive in April 2013. With an enhanced team of volunteers and expanded drop off locations, the drive was IWA's most successful one yet. People donated enthusiastically and we managed to collect almost 2000 kg worth of clothes, toys, books and other essential items to be distributed India wide to the most needy. Thirty volunteers contributed their invaluable time and energy towards the cause. Prior to the drive the IWA team organized a volunteer briefing session. We thank veteran Goonj volunteer Ramya Nageshwar who helmed the show and all those who opened their homes for donation drop off.

2. COLLABORATION with SINDA

IWA had also met with SINDA for collaboration and volunteering opportunities. Piu Lahiri(President), Mohini Kumar and Ms. Mehak Krishnaman met with Mr. S. Devendran (Head of Volunteer Engagement and Community Development) and his team on 14th March 2013. Mr. Devendran shed light on the various programmes in SINDA like its mentoring programmes, tuition programmes and the "learning with fun" programmes. The IWA Team also attended the talk on the Athena Project for single mothers and teenaged pregnancies. The counseling techniques and the process adopted by SINDA were highlighted.

In October, IWA volunteers assisted SINDA staff to make a life size Rangoli at the Arts and Science Museum. There was a huge volunteer turn out at this event.

SINDA requested IWA volunteers to be part of their Diwali Bazaar, assisting SINDA staff with Project Give. It was a good opportunity for IWA volunteers to spread awareness about SINDA and encourage people to donate generously to Project Give which raises funds for the education of underprivileged children in India.

3. ORISSA FUNDRAISER: Meeting with Anshu Gupta

In November 2013. Mr Anshu Gupta from Goonj addressed both IWA and non-IWA participants, highlighting the extent of the Orissa flood disaster and the relief work that Goonj has been doing in the flood hit areas. He told us that financial help would be more beneficial rather than donations in kind. Later a presentation was made before the Executive Committee highlighting the extent of disaster and seeking ideas as to how funds could be raised for the same. One of the ideas that came up was to raise money individually through e-pledges by publicizing the cause on the IWA Facebook page. Other ideas were through organizing events like exhibitions and a walk- a- thon or a run. However the process also involves acquiring a fundraising permit from the Commissioner of Charity and the fundraiser event needs to be organized within six months of the disaster. Information has been gathered to apply for the fundraising permit.

4. COLLABORATION WITH BEYOND SOCIAL SERVICES (BSS)

The IWA Community Services Team met with Ms Cheryl Lek (Community Engagement and Volunteer Management Head) to seek volunteering opportunities for IWA members and non-members alike. BSS is an NGO working with children to reduce juvenile delinquency amongst children and youth through familial and community support. Extracurricular activities such as organizing music and dance workshops, art and craft d sessions, along with games and storytelling sessions were highlighted. A Volunteer orientation for all IWA members was organized recently at the BSS office in January 2014. Eight members from the IWA team attended the volunteer orientation event. On the 2^{7th} January 2014 IWA team participated in a sharing session at Whampoa Drive along with an observation session with children. The sharing was fruitful as it highlighted the various possible activities that could be done with children like art and craft, games, reading and storytelling. It was decided that IWA members and non-members would conduct an interactive session with children from Waterfall Student Care at Redhill MRT to celebrate Valentine's Day on 1^{4th} February 2014. Ms. Raja, the BSS teacher in charge conducted the sharing.

5. DONATION TO FAMILY OF MIGRANT WORKER J GUNASEKARAN (IWA initiated)

In October, Piu Lahiri and Tara Dhar initiated a spontaneous collection drive for an Indian migrant worker who was killed in a work related accident. IWA members gave generously but soon the community at large got involved and we as a community, including many non-IWA members were able to remit SGD 2000 to his widow with the help of our new Deputy High Commissioner.

6. SWAMI HOME COLLABORATION

Continuing our beautiful relationship with the SWAMI Home residents, IWA's CARE team headed by Mohini Kumar, Piu Lahiri and Manjula Bains, organized four events at the SWAMI Home this year.

We raised most of our stipulated budget of \$1200 per event through kind donations & sponsorships from our members. All four events were well attended by members and their families. Continuing a well-loved tradition, we celebrated birthdays of the residents at each event, and played a host of interactive games with them and then handed out useful gifts to all the residents. Each event also included special performances to complement the theme of the day.

In the spring, our **Vaisakhi** event was warmed by lively Indian music from the IWA Music Club led by Ms Raji Vishwanathan. This was followed by an impromptu dance performance by IWA volunteers that got many residents and their caregivers tapping their feet and even joining in.

The Autumn Visit- **Gokul Ashtami** event introduced Lord Krishna to the residents of Swami Home. Ms Sugandha Aggarwal donated a unique Blue 'Krishna Cake'. The highlight of the event was a professional Odissi dance recital by the famous dance troupe Chitrakala Arts, led by Chitra Shankar.

The winter Visit-**Christmas** season doubled in joy and celebration. The Well-known artiste Ms Noella Menon joined in with her family to lead the Carol singing. Capt Gurwinder Singh Bains brought many smiles with his jolly Santa Claus act, wishing and distributing gifts. IWA member, Sukanya Pushkarna made the event more meaningful by reading out the 'The Fuzzy Christmas Story' in Mandarin & English. It was indeed a Merry Christmas!

The Festival of Colours- Holi, ushered in the Spring of 2014. The highlight of this gathering was a scintillating and colorful dandiya performance by the Sampada dance group. IWA music club members also sang a Hindi song. A 'Heartfelt thanks' to all who donated their time and money so generously this year to make these events successful.
